GENDER AUDIT

The gender audit was conducted at Sree Narayana College Chengannur by IQAC and the Women's study unit of college. The audit was carried out at the college to study the gender balance and gender stability existing within the institution. It gave an opportunity to analyze the status of gender equality prevailing at the college and the progress of women's empowerment in society. The present study was based on the data collected from all the departments of the college for a period from 2018 to 2023. The details were collected in an information format prepared for the purpose of a gender audit.

Objectives of Gender Audit

- To monitor and reduce gender discrimination in the institution
- To identify the gaps and challenges in gender equality and establish a baseline for Gender Equality
- To find out the areas where gender imbalance exists and the reasons for inequality
- To suggest new strategies and policies for gender balance
- To foster gender equality in all aspects of college community.
- To establish good gender balance in decision-making processes in all areas of the college activities.
- To observe the college's efforts and competence to prevent sexual harassment.



Figure 1: Gender wise details of total students in the college




The table shows year-wise gender classification of male and female students and the total number of students admitted to the college. It shows that the number of female students is higher compared to male.

Figure: 2 Gender wise details of Permanent Teaching staff in college




The total number of female teaching staff is more as compared to male. This proves that college management maintains gender equality in workplace.

Figure: 3 Gender wise details of Assistant Professor on contract in college




The female participation is much more than male participation under the category of Assistant Professor on contract.

Figure: 4 Gender wise Details of Non-Teaching staff in college




The total number of male non-teaching staff is more compared to females.

Figure: 5 Gender wise details of students enrolled in the NSS activities of college



Figure: 6 Gender wise details of students enrolled for various courses of college from 2018 to 2022.




The gender audit data suggest that the number of female students enrolling for PG courses is more than that of UG courses.



A total number of 85 students responded to the questionnaire. The responses are represented in the following diagrams.




The college conducts gender awareness programs as a part of its curriculum




Adequate number of toilets are available in the campus for girls.




Adequate facilities are available inside the toilet, keeping in mind the need of the girl students.




Awareness of Students about Women Cell




There are lady faculties available in the Women Cell







Salient Findings of the Audit Team:

- Number of girl students admitted at the college is higher than boys for all five years.
- Female: male ratio in the staff is fairly high in all academic years.
- The number of male staff is more compared to female in the non-teaching sector.
- Participation of male in NSS activities is greater than the female. It is necessary to
 motivate girls to participate in NSS activities because it can create social awareness
 among them.
- Special awareness programmes are organized for girls by women cell.
- The college has a functional Women's Study Unit and an ICC.
- Majority of the students are aware about the functioning of Grievance Redressal cell in the college.
- The college conducts gender sensitization activities to orient the students and staff members.

Suggestions:

- Define and deepen the understanding of concepts regarding gender equality and empowerment of women.
- Organize more sports programmes for female students and staff members on a regular basis.
- Introduce more skill enhancement programmes for girls.
- Display posters for women helpline numbers and instructions at the college under the guidance of women's cell
- Improvise toilet facilities for girls at college.
- Enhance cultural programs and women's participation under the guidance of various clubs
- Organize self-defense programmes for girls on a regular basis.
- Conduct awareness program on legal rights.
- Introduce self-employment trainings in different subjects.

Conclusion:

The gender audit showed that the institution sticks to its gender equity goals and objective, which are incorporated in all the policies and programmes of the college. The gender-based analysis of student enrolment and employees, reveals the progress of the institution towards gender equality. According to female students, they never encountered any problems related to gender discrimination at the college. It is further evaluated that the gender equality and gender



SELF DEFENCE AWARENESS TALK




Session on personal hygiene


