PLASTIC FREE CAMPAIGN

On 2nd February 2023, the NSS units and College Union of Sree Narayana College Chengannur conducted an awareness rally on the ill effects of indiscriminate usage of plastic at Ala Panchayath. NATURE EDUCATION CAMP
