














Essay Writing Competition






Reading Week Observance







Various channels are available for reporting incidents of harassment, such as anonymous reporting, dedicated email and designated personnel. The college emphasize the confidentiality and protection provided to complainants during the reporting process. During the period 2022 – 23 no such harassment activities had reported. If any type of Harassment related activities will be reported, an enquiry will be conducted by the committee and disciplinary actions will suggest to the college council against perpetrators, including reprimands, warnings, suspensions, or terminations. Harassment Prevention Committee of the Sree Narayana College also consider the resources and support services available to victims of harassment, such as counseling, legal assistance, or employee assistance programs. As part of the efficiency improvement of the committee, committee track and assess the effectiveness of harassment prevention efforts, such as regular data collection, surveys, or focus groups.

HUMAN RIGHTS FORUM

The general objective of the Human Rights forum of the college is to create awareness among the students about human rights and to enable students to recognize the importance of human rights and to create a human environment within the college. Students welcomed the guests and gathering with the visual delight of 'pooja dance. Mrs Bindhu V K, Coordinator of Women Study Unit welcomed the gathering. Dr Shereen K, Principal of the college delivered the presidential address. She encouraged the youths to uplift human values. Adv Seena S Nair (District Court, Pathanamthitta) lead a class on "Women Centric law". She has explained it in detail about some sections which is protecting women rights. A number of laws and constitutional provisions are centred on safeguarding the rights of women and protecting them against violence in India. Indians are guaranteed the basic rights to live a dignified life without any discrimination based on gender, race, caste, religion and other identities – under article 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution. Likewise, the document also provides for the welfare, representation and wellbeing of women, by setting out the principles on which the state can frame laws for them. Under article 15(3), for instance, the constitution enables the state to make special provisions for women and children if need be to eradicate discrimination and enhance access to public spaces. Similarly, under article 16, women are entitled to equal opportunity for employment to any office. She has discussed about The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, The Maternity Benefit Act 1961, Free legal aid under legal services act, Property rights. The session was really eve opening to everyone. There was an open discussion arranged after the technical session and students raised many doubts regarding some laws and the advocate clarified their doubts. Mrs Hemalatha Mohan delivered the inaugural address. Mrs aswathy Raj Coordinator of Human Rights concluded the meeting by delivering vote of thanks

Constitution Day Observance



Reading Week





Talk with writer






WORLD WETLANDS DAY


WORLD WATER DAY


As part of the Reading week, the Literary and Debate Club in association with The Department of Languages and National Service Scheme Units 49 A & B has organized various programmes in the college.





NSS volunteers of the college conducted an awareness campaign inside the campus and they stressed the importance of controlling population for the development of the country




Kargil Vijay Diwas July 26


1.1 Participation in Three Day Residential Training on Palliative Care July 27 to July 29



Invited Talk on women Centric Law November 18

A class on Women Centric Law conducted in association with Human Rights Forum and Women Cell

Mrs Bindhu V K, Coordinator of Women Study Unit welcomed the gathering. Dr Shereen K, Principal of the college delivered the presidential address. She encouraged the youths to uplift human values.

Adv Seena S Nair(District Court, Pathanamthitta) lead a class on "Women Centric law". She has explained it in detail about some sections which is protecting women rights. A number of laws

and constitutional provisions are centred on safeguarding the rights of women and protecting them against violence in India. Indians are guaranteed the basic rights to live a dignified life – without any discrimination based on gender, race, caste, religion and other identities – under article 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution. Likewise, the document also provides for the welfare, representation and wellbeing of women, by setting out the principles on which the state can frame laws for them. Under article 15(3), for instance, the constitution enables the state to make special provisions for women and children if need be to eradicate discrimination and enhance access to public spaces. Similarly, under article 16, women are entitled to equal opportunity for employment to any office. She has discussed about The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, The Maternity Benefit Act 1961, free legal aid under legal services act, Property rights.

The session was really eye opening to everyone. Globally, the existence of awareness campaigns since 1988 has been a major boon, as the number of new patients has declined by 32% since 2010, and AIDS-related deaths have decreased by 68% since 2004.

This year 2022, the AIDS Day theme is "Equalize", which emphasizes eliminating the inequalities that have slowed the fight against the disease. The inequalities, such as gender inequality, limit women's access to HIV care and other forms of sexual and reproductive health care, which in turn affects their decision-making capabilities and their capacity to decline unwanted sexual encounters or negotiate for safer ones.
