
Adv Seena S Nair(District Court, Pathanamthitta) lead a class on "Women Centric law". She has explained it in detail about some sections which is protecting women rights. A number of laws and constitutional provisions are centred on safeguarding the rights of women and protecting them against violence in India. Indians are guaranteed the basic rights to live a

dignified life – without any discrimination based on gender, race, caste, religion and other identities – under article 15 and 21 of the Indian Constitution. Likewise, the document also provides for the welfare, representation and wellbeing of women, by setting out the principles on which the state can frame laws for them. Under article 15(3), for instance, the constitution enables the state to make special provisions for women and children if need be to eradicate discrimination and enhance access to public spaces. Similarly, under article 16, women are entitled to equalopportunity for employment to any office. She has discussed about The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005, The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013, Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961, The Maternity Benefit Act 1961, free legal aid under legal services act, Property rights.

The session was really eye opening to everyone. There was an open discussion arranged after the technical session and students raised many doubts regarding some laws and the advocate clarified their doubts.

Mrs Hemalatha Mohan delivered the inaugural address. While elaborating on the key aim of the forum she emphasized importance



The Constitution offers a framework for the government of the country to keep in mind the social, religious, and cultural diversity of the nation.








3.5 Cake Challenge


3.7 Participation in Three Day Residential Training on Palliative Care July 27 to July 29







Building Resilience: Focused on developing resilience, self-esteem, and self-confidence among participants. These qualities can help individuals navigate challenging situations and make healthy choices, even in the face of peer pressure or stressful circumstances.



World AIDS Day is a globally commemorated healthcare event observed every year on the 1st of December for the past 33 years (since 1988). The need for AIDS awareness day is essential as HIV infection is currently incurable, but one can control it with good quality education about the disease, especially in rural areas. It was once an unmanageable chronic health condition, but now, with advances in HIV prevention, diagnosis, and care including for opportunistic infections, people with HIV can live long and healthy lives. Globally, the existence of awareness campaigns since 1988 has been a major boon, as the number of new patients has declined by 32% since 2010, and AIDS-related deaths have decreased by 68% since 2004.

This year 2022, the AIDS Day theme is "Equalize", which emphasizes eliminating the inequalities that have slowed the fight against the disease. The inequalities, such as gender inequality, limit women's access to HIV care and other forms of sexual and reproductive health

care, which in turn affects their decision-making capabilities and their capacity to decline unwanted sexual encounters or negotiate for safer ones.

There are many actions; one can take to prevent the transmission of HIV to others, as the famous quote says "Prevention is better than cure".






VOLUNTARY BLOOD DONATION AWARENESS PROGRAMME

Palliative Care Programs

INTRODUCTION Palliative care is a specialized medical care for the people living with a serious illness. This type of care is focused on providing relief from the symptoms and stress of the illness. Palliative care is an interdisciplinary medical care giving approach aimed at optimizing quality of life and mitigating suffering among people with serious, complex illnesses. Engaging students in palliative care has a dual advantage. One is that their energy can be utilized for the benefit of patients with chronic disease. Another is that, inculcating the spirit of care can have a positive effect on the attitude of the students. The student palliative care unit is an initiative by the NSS unit (Unit No. 49 A & B) of SN College Chengannur. The Volunteers who all attended the training got the classes in introduction to palliative care, Home based palliative care, Psycho- social support & community participation, communication, concept of students initiative in palliative care, Testimony by SIPC volunteers and feedback session and action plan. After this training our volunteers got the participant certificate and they formed a cell in our college for palliative care.

3. UNIT LEVEL TRAINING The NSS Volunteers who all got the Palliative training in University level and District level had conducted the unit level training. By this training all our NSS volunteers got trained in Palliative care



4. HOME VISITS After this training our volunteers got the participant certificate and they formed a cell in our college for palliative care. In the NSS camp our cell organization members take an orientation class started by the volunteers. When we execute our plan into the action we took ward 4,2,3,8,1 of Cheriyanad Panchayath in Alappuzha for our project. From this word we have selected the eligible persons and done our best to them. A small group of volunteers collect the details of patients who must have the palliative care near to the college. The NSS volunteers (unit no: 49a&b) of our college have organized a palliative care program on 21st and 22nd December 2021, 2pm to 5:30pm. They are divided into two groups to interact with the patient's and bystanders home through this programme. The spirit of palliative care can have a positive effect on the patients and on our team volunteers. The program was led by NSS volunteer Dhanya P S, Sreelekshmi, in the presence of volunteer secretary Avani Suseelan, Abin A and other volunteers. Then we got best support from our program officers Dr. Nishad .A & Smt. Bindu .VK, and the practical support and guidance were from Cheriyanad FHC Palliative nurse Bindu Udayakumar.



The main objective of SIP is to those under the tight grip of deadly disease, struggling with pain and living in a dark room is extended a helping hand and brought out into the light and the bedridden are supported and sheltered and the tears and troubles of the people, the one who are suffering, in pain and those in hunger will be assisted by the members of the Students Initiative in Palliative Care Unit to relieve their troubles. On the 20th and 21st January 2022, from morning onwards we have started the activity at 10:00am and the same day, we started our practical sessions from 1.30 pm to 5:30 pm. Our action team were actually done their job very happily and they all are excited to do this project as their own responsibility in the pandemic situation. Patients in the ward close to the college were given the high priority. We have completed this mission considering all the eligible families



5. SUPPLY OF MEDICINS The goal of palliative care is to relieve the suffering of patients and their families by the comprehensive diagnosis and treatment. By engaging students in palliative care, their energy can be utilized for the benefit of patients with chronic disease and their participation will inculcate the spirit of care and positive effect. Student Palliative Care links the local palliative care units, which function in different parts of the local areas, by which students are becoming active volunteers in fund collection and home care. Our NSS Volunteers had promised to support the patients by selling products made by patients to raise the fund. For this our NSS Volunteers are planning to do the campaign in selected areas to spread the concept of helping palliative patients and the relevance of society to support the helpless patients.



The third group of volunteers prepared the medical facilities including medicines, diapers stretching ball, stretching band etc., and the fourth group taken the responsibility of preparing the food kit. Then the fifth group of volunteers had provided the transportation facilities, and the palliative care cell coordinators of our college, program officers, palliative care nurse, and Asha works had helped us to reach out to the patients. Another group of volunteers rechecked the data of palliative care patients and conducted the survey. Thereby we can understand the patient's situation and can suggest solution to their problems. Through the survey palliative care volunteers got a better idea regarding the problems of the patients.



Sree Narayana College Chengannur had started a campus Pain & Palliative Centre to provide specialized medical and nursing care for people with life-limiting illnesses. The centre is associated with National Service Scheme units of the college.



8. COUNSELING FACILITIES PROVIDED Our Palliative care volunteers provide the counseling facilities to the palliative patients. The volunteers who all got the university level and district level palliative care training had given the counseling to the palliative patients.





5.1 Doctors Day





5.4 COVID-19 CARE AND PREVENTION:


WEBINAR 2/08/2020








5.5 Hiroshima day


5.8 OCTOBER 2- GANDHI JAYANTHI












DECEMBER 1 -WORLD AIDS DAY

Report on the Flood Relief Activities

The classrooms were opened for the refugees as the camp on 16th August 2018.





After few days, as the flood turn out to be worse, the college (camp) itself was isolated and the refugees and the students in the college hostels (hostelers) were immediately airlifted to the safer camps in the near town areas.

1. "SwachhVidyalaya" Mega Cleaning Programme in association with Southern Railway (28-08-18) (5 volunteers)
