


As part of the Reading week, the Literary and Debate Club in association with The Department of Languages and National Service Scheme Units 49 A & B has organized various programmes in the college.





3.6 Participation in Three Day Residential Training on Palliative Care


July 27 to July 29

3.9 Vimukthi Training Program

Arjun A J of Second year Commerce has been selected for the District level one day Training Programme on Vimukthi by National Service scheme, University of Kerala in association with Kerala Excise Department on 29 October 2022 at BJM Govt. College, Chavara.

The Training Programme discussed the following points

Education on Drugs: Provided information about different types of drugs, their effects on the body and mind, the risks associated with drug use, and the potential consequences of drug abuse. This helps participants understand the dangers and negative impacts of drugs.

Prevention Strategies: Taught participants strategies for preventing drug abuse, including refusal skills, stress management techniques, healthy coping mechanisms, and decision-making skills. These skills empower individuals to make informed choices and resist peer pressure.

Risk Factors and Protective Factors: Discussed the various risk factors that contribute to drug abuse, such as social, environmental, and individual factors. Building Resilience: Focused on developing resilience, self-esteem, and self-confidence among participants. These qualities can help individuals navigate challenging situations and make healthy choices, even in the face of peer pressure or stressful circumstances.

Awareness of Legal Consequences: Educated participants about the legal consequences associated with drug use, possession, and trafficking. This helps them understand the potential legal risks and reinforces the importance of avoiding drug-related activities.

Resources and Support: Provided information about available resources and support systems for individuals struggling with drug abuse or seeking assistance. This can include help lines, counseling services, support groups, and treatment centers.

Interactive Activities and Discussions: Engaged participants in interactive activities, role-plays, case studies, and group discussions to encourage active participation and reinforce learning.








Interaction session with the students during Induction Programme


3.13 IQAC Orientation Class




3.14 Skill Enhancement Programme & Extension activity


3.15 UGC-CSIR NET ORIENTATION CLASS








5.1 Internal Mentoring Session






5.3 Practicality of Studying Science








5.4 Moodle - Learning Management System

Report of Two Day Workshop on "Computational Modeling and Drug Design" on 4-5 th April 2018 at Department of Chemistry, SN College Chengannur Computational modeling techniques have long been used for the synthesis of molecular structure and cost-effective (virtual) experimental analysis prior to synthesis. Computational techniques, especially molecular modeling, play a vital role in the drug design process. Ideally, the computational method will be able to predict affinity before a compound is synthesized and hence save enormous time and cost. Although progress was being made in computer aided drug design, the potential for high-throughput screening had begun to take precedence as a means for finding novel therapeutics. The method has the advantage of requiring minimal compound design or prior knowledge, and technologies required to screen large libraries have become more efficient. Most importantly, drug design projects may fail without the efforts of experts in computational modeling. Our department is involved in the identification of phytochemical based leads using computational methods such as Schrodinger software. At this context we organized a workshop under the spronsorshop of Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) to promote the scientific aspirations of post graduate students,

researchers and faculties from various colleges in Kerala. The workshop was also intended to provide a common platform for the delegates to share knowledge and to plan strategies for modern drug research by intellectual interaction with experts in the field. The workshop started with the registration at 9.00 AM on 4th April 2018. The inauguration function of programme began with an invocation by the students of our college. Dr. Rejikumar, Associate Professor and Principal in Charge presided over the function. Dr. Smitha Sasidhran, Convenor of the workshop welcomed the distinguished guests, invited speakers, delegates, faculties and students to the workshop. Prof. Sabu Thomas, Pro-Vice Chancellor, Mahatma Gandhi University inaugurated the workshop by lighting up the lamp and he also delivered the inaugural address. He inspired the students with the motivational speech and he also emphasized the significance of computational methods for the development of new drugs. He also said that the proper usage and implementation of the Schrodinger software can reduce the time and cost in the area of drug research. Dr. M S Latha, Head, Department of Chemistry delivered vote of thanks in the inaugural function. The inauguration function was followed by Key Note Address by Nandakumar Kalarikkal, Director, Inter University Centre for Nanoscience and Nanotechnology, Mahatma Gandhi University. He congratulated Department of Chemistry for taking initiative to organise the workshop which covers fundamental as well as advanced level of knowledge and hands on training on computational modeling and drug designing. He shared his views on the usage of software for drug designing. After the tea break Dr. M S Latha give an introductory talk on the workshop, Schrodinger software and its application for drug designing. Later Dr. Sreejalekshmi, Associate Professor from IIST, Trivandrum delivered an invited talk on "Fundamentals of Computational Modeling". The delegates and students were highly inspired by her way of presentation and fruitful discussion. After the lunch break hands on training on software continues till 4.00 pm. Mrs. Sruthy and Miss Nayana, Research Scholars of Department of Chemistry assisted the delegates during training sessions. Faculty of members of the Department of Chemistry and Dr. Sreejalekshmi were also available for technical assistance and discussion during training.
