INTRODUCTION

The College is named after the great saint and social reformer Sree Narayana Guru. It stands as a monument that reminds us of the great doctrines of the Guru.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

The motto of the college is '**Enlightenment through Education**' and it endeavours to mould a community of students committed to the pursuit of truth and moral excellence upholding the high ideals of Sree Narayana Guru, our patron. We aim at building up a humane and socially committed fraternity of young men and women by the upliftment of the downtrodden masses through education.

It was His Holiness Narayana Guru's call to seek "**liberation through education**" which inspired the distinguished citizens of this backward area to start a new college. The basic objectives of the institution is to provide education to the marginalised section of the society. The college stands for academic excellence as well as development of the skill and character of students based on the Holy Guru's perspectives on humanism, secularism and universal brotherhood.

Our institution is a major centre for higher education offering educational opportunities to the rural community. A large number of our students adorn coveted positions in India and abroad. They have contributed to the general development of the area. The Majority of the students of our college belongs to the backward classes with 70 to 80% comprising of girls, striving to achieve the goal of equal access and equal opportunity, in all walks of life.

The college is situated in a beautiful place 6 kms away from Chengannur. It started functioning in 1981, offering Pre-Degree courses in I, II, III & IV groups. A new block was constructed and was formally inaugurated on 31st August 1990. The college was upgraded in 1991 by starting B.Sc.Chemistry. B.A. Economics was started in 1994. B.Com (Elective - Computer Application) was started in 1998. M.Sc.Chemistry was started in 1999 and B.Sc.Physics in 2001. M.Sc Medicinal Chemistry was started in 2012, M.Sc Physics (2013) & B.Sc Mathematics (2014).

University of Kerala has introduced Semesterization and Grading for all the undergraduate courses in affiliated colleges from 2010 admission onwards. The undergraduate course is renamed as the First Degree Programme and the System is Choice Based Credit and Semester (CBCSS). The study components include Language Course, Foundation Course, Core Course in the major subject, Complementary Course in allied subjects. Open/Elective course, Project/Dissertation and Social Service/Extension Activity for not less than 40 hours.

FIRST DEGREE PROGRAMME-CBCS SYSTEM

The University of Kerala offers the First Degree Programmes under the Choice Based Credit and Semester (CBCS) system in Affiliated Colleges.

- **Programme** means the entire Course of study as per the given Scheme and Examinations.
- **Semester** means a term consisting of a minimum of 90 working days distributed over a minimum period of 18 weeks.
- **Course** means a portion of a subject to be taught and evaluated in a semester.

Credit (C) of a Course is a measure of the weekly unit of work involving lecture or laboratory session or seminar or similar activity assigned to for the Course

First Degree Programmes Structure

- 1) Language Courses-courses in English and an additional language of student's choice
- 2) Foundation Courses-Course at the foundation level
- 3) Core Courses in the Major Subjects related to Degree Programmes
- 4) Complementary Courses on allied subjects
- 5) Open Course-a Non-Major Elective Course offered by the Departments other than the Parent Department
- 6) Elective Courses-Specialized Course from the Core Subject, offered by the Parent Department and
- 7) Project/Dissertation-done either individually or by a group not exceeding five students. Viva-Voce based on the Project/

Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The report of the Project/ Dissertation shall be submitted to the Department in duplicate before the completion of the sixth semester.

Language Courses and Foundation Courses are offered in the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters. Core Courses are offered from the 1st semester onwards along with the Complementary Courses and include a compulsory Project/Dissertation to be undertaken during the 5th/6th semester. Elective courses are courses offered by Parent Department during 6th Semester in the frontier areas/related areas of the Major subject. Open courses are courses which fall outside the area of the Major Subject of studies and are offered by the Departments other than the Parent Department during 5th Semester.

Social Service/Extension Activity

It is mandatory for a student to participate in any one of the following Social Service/Extension Activities offered by the college for not less than forty hours, during the 3rd and 4th semesters, for successful completion of the Programme. 1. Nature Club (Bhoomi thrasena Club), 2. Health Education 3. Human Rights Forum 4. NSS, 5. Science Club 6. Sports Club 7. Women's Study 8. Centre for Gandhian Studies.

Evaluation and Grading

The Evaluation of each Course consists of two parts

1) Continuous Evaluation(CE)

The marks of CE shall be consolidated by adding the marks of Attendance, Assignment/ Seminar and Test paper respectively for a particular Course.

Attendance (Max. marks 5)

The allotment of marks for attendance shall be as follows:

less than 51 %	0 mark
51% to 60%	1 mark

There shall be a subject wise minimum of 50% attendance and aggregate 75% of attendance for registering end semester examination.

Assignments or Seminars (Max. marks 5)

Each student shall be required to do one assignment or one seminar for each Course.

Tests (Max. marks 10)

For each course there shall be one class test during a semester.

Components of Practical for CE

The marks for the components of Practical for Continuous Evaluation shall be as shown below.

1. Attendance	5 marks
2. Record	5 marks
3. Test	5 marks
4. Performance, Punctuality and Skill	5 marks

2) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

End Semester Evaluation of all the Courses in all the semesters shall be conducted by the University. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for ESE and maximum of 20 marks for CE for all Courses (Theory and Practical). The marks of a Course are consolidated by combining the marks of ESE and CE. A minimum of 35% marks (E Grade) is required for passing a Course with a separate minimum of 35% (E Grade) for Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Evaluation.

Indirect Grading System

Both CE and ESE will be carried out using Indirect Grading system on a 7-point scale. Grade indicates the level of performance of a student in a Course. Grade Point is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a Course. The student secures the Credits assigned to a Course on successful completion of the Course. The students shall be required to earn a minimum of 120 Credits including Credits for Language Courses, Foundation Courses, Core Courses, Complementary Courses, Dissertation, Open and elective Courses within a minimum period of 6 Semesters for the award of the Degree excluding Credit acquired for Social Service/Extension Activity. The product of Grade Point and the Credit of a Course is called 'Credit Point'.

Semester Credit Point Average (SCPA) is an index of the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points obtained by a student at the end of a semester by the sum of the Credits of Courses taken by the student in the semester. Cumulative Credit Point Average (CCPA) indicates the broad academic level of performance of the student in a Programme. It is obtained by dividing the sum of the Credit Points in all the Courses taken by the student for the entire Programme by the total number of Credits.

For the successful completion of a Programme and award of the Degree, a student must pass all Courses satisfying the minimum Credit requirement as given in clause 7.8 and must score a minimum CCPA of 3.5 or an overall grade of E.

Repetition of the Semester Courses:

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendance during a semester shall be given one chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission.

Re-appearance of Failed Students:

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students. Candidates who fail to score 'E' grade in the ESE in any of the Course/Courses have to reappear for the ESE of the Course /Courses concerned with next regular batch of students.

Improvement of ESE

Candidates who have successfully completed the Semester, but wish to improve their marks for the End Semester Evaluation (ESE) shall have only one chance for the same along with the next immediate regular batch of students. In this case, the better marks obtained shall be considered for the calculation of SCPA.

BYE - LAW

1. All students of the college are bound by the rules and regulations of the college.
2. Every student is expected to be regular and punctual in attending the college.
3. Students should keep silence inside the classrooms and the premises of the college during working hours.
4. Students who do not attend the class during any period should remain in the reading room or in vacant classrooms and utilize the time profitably
5. Students are expected to keep the college buildings and campus neat and tidy. Writing and making marks on the walls or furniture or dropping ink on the floor or throwing paper any where except in the receptacle is strictly prohibited.
6. Prior permission of the Principal is necessary
 - a) For organizing special meetings, entertainments or social functions.
 - b) For inviting persons who are not members of the teaching staff of the college for any function in the college.
 - c) For collection and subscription of any kind from the teaching or non teaching staff of the college.
 - d) For distribution or display of any literature.
7. Students should get prior permission of the Principal for residing in places other than with their parents.
8. Smoking is strictly prohibited in the college and its premises.
9. Any student suspended from the college is not allowed to enter the college or its premises during the period of suspension.

10. Students are strictly forbidden from engaging in activities, political or otherwise, which interferes with the normal life and work of the college.
11. Notice signed or countersigned by the Principal and published on the Notice Board should be taken as having been brought to the notice of the members of the college.
12. Every student should wear clean and respectable clothes in the college.
13. When a teacher enters a class the students shall rise and remain standing till they are directed to sit or till the teacher takes his/her seat.
14. When the Principal or a visitor enters a classroom the students shall stand up and will remain standing till they are directed to sit-down.
15. Students are strictly forbidden from entering classes other than those allotted to them.
16. In every class, a student shall have a special seat and shall not occupy any other seat with out permission of the lecturer incharge of the class.
17. No student shall be allowed to leave the class room without the permission of the lecturer incharge of the class until the class is dismissed.
18. Students should respect college property.
19. Any question not covered by the above rules will be decided by the Principal.

REGULATIONS

Revised rules for collection and refund of fees in government and private colleges which come under the payment scheme in Kerala State.

(Vide G.O. (M.S.) No. 95/74/H Edn, Dated 12th June 1974)

1. Tuition fee will be collected in three equal instalments in the months of June, October and January, respectively. The first instalment including special fees prescribed and caution deposit will be collected at the time of admission.
2. Subsequent instalment will be collected on or before the 7th consecutive working day of the concerned month. The principal of the college may fix the due date for collection of fees for each instalment for various classes within seven consecutive working days.
3. The Principal is competent to change the fee date for a particular class/classes so fixed to an earlier or to subsequent date of it so happens that the college is ordered to remain closed for collection of fees. In such cases copy of the notice of the Principal notifying the change of date should be preserved and produced for Audit Purposes.
4. If any student fails to pay the fees or special fees on the due date, he/she is liable to pay a fine of Rs. 20/- along with the fees or special fees on or before the 10th day after due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, next working day will be counted as the 10th day.
5. If the fees or special fees with a fine Rs. 20/- not paid on or before the last date fixed then an additional fine Rs. 5/- will have to be paid. If the fees and fine are not paid before the last oppor-

tunity given for payment of the instalment, the name of the student will be removed from rolls of the college with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and the student will not get the benefit of attendance also from the date of removal from the rolls of the college. If the student is to be readmitted, he/she has to apply for special permission of the Principal and also has to remit all the arrears of fees. A fine Rs. 75/- will be realised as readmission fee in such cases of readmission. These students will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of admission.

6. The last opportunity for the payment of an instalment of fees mentioned in para. 5 above is defined as the last working day previous to the due date of the succeeding instalment. But in the case of the last instalment, i.e. fee due for February the last opportunity is fixed as 5th March.
7. The terms are defined clearly as follows
 - I Sem : June, July, August and September,
 - II Sem : October, November and December
 - III Sem : January, February and March
8. Students who are admitted for a term to compensate shortage of attendance for the course which the students was undergoing should pay one-third of the tuition fees for the year together with full special fees and caution deposit at the time of admission.
9. In the case of casual students (Undergoing one year course) all fees including special fees and caution deposit due for whole year will be collected at the time of admission.

**SCHEDULE OF FEES
FEE CONCESSION & SCHOLARSHIP**

As per Kumara Pillai Commission Report, forward community students are also eligible for education concessions provided the annual income from all sources of their parents does not exceed Rs. 100000/- in the case of P.G. Classes Rs. 100000/- in the case of Degree Classes students who secure 45% or more marks at the respective qualifying examination and pass at the first appearance are eligible for unified fee concession subject to the income limit specified. Those who admission and secure not less than 50% marks in the qualifying examination are eligible for Kerala State Scholarship subject to income limits specified.

ADMISSION & WITHDRAWAL

1. Application for the admission must be made in the prescribed form. Applicants should produce the necessary documents before admission.

2. Students coming from other universities should produce the Migration Certificate at the time of admission.
3. No candidate for admission will be enrolled or allowed to attend any class until the prescribed fees have been paid
4. No student shall be considered to have been enrolled in the college unless he/she has attended at least a days class during the term or has not paid the fees fixed by the Govt./University.
5. A student who after being admitted applies for a transfer certificate, even without attending class for a day will have to pay the fees as per rules
6. No certificate will be sent by post unless a self addressed stamped envelope is enclosed.
7. A student applying for T.C. shall pay all fees as per rules.
8. A student applying for any certificate shall do so in the prescribed form.

ATTENDANCE & LEAVE OF ABSENCE

1. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each period and absence during one period will be counted as absence for the whole session.
2. Application for leave should be submitted in the prescribed form in advance to the lecturer in charge.
3. Serious action will be taken against those who do not attend the class without leave permission.
4. Every student has to earn 75% of attendance for each semester. Those who do not earn the required attendance will not be permitted to appear for the University Exam.
5. Students should see that they have sufficient no. of days of attendance for each semester.

LAWS OF LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

1. The library and reading room will be kept open from 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on all days except sundays and public holidays
2. Books for the reference are not issued to students except for reference in the reading room.
3. A **UG Student** can borrow only two books and **PG student** can borrow four books at a time. Book will be issued only on production of borrowers card.
4. The book issued to students shall not be retained for more than two weeks. Failure to return the book on the due date entitles a fine of Rs. 1 per day.
5. Books taken during vacation shall be returned within the first three working days after the reopening of the college.
6. Transfer or sub lending of books is strictly prohibited.
7. Marking, tearing away of the page, underlining etc. in any book, manuscript or map belonging to the library is absolutely forbidden.
8. Books borrowed from the library should be returned forth with when the librarian demands.
9. When borrowing a book, students shall bring to the notice of the librarian, damages if any in the book. Otherwise they will be held responsible for such damage.
10. If books issued are lost, the student concerned will have to replace it or pay three times of the price of the book along with the fine fixed.
11. Borrower's card will be issued to students from the library. When the card is lost, a duplicate card will be issued from the college office on payment of Rs.20/-
12. No paper or periodical lying on the table shall be removed from the reading room or from the place allotted to it.
13. Loud reading and talking in the reading room are strictly forbidden.
14. Any loss, damage etc will have to be compensated person responsible for it.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

NSS aims at education through community services. It is a part of the Youth Welfare Programme of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

The College has two N.S.S. units. Volunteers are given training to engage themselves in constructive work. Volunteers who complete 240 hours of social work and who attend a 7 days camp during the course of two years are given University Certificate. Smt. Bindu V.K. (Dept. of Malayalam) and Dr. Nishad A (Dept. of Commerce) are the Programme Officers.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

The Tutorial system is functioning well in the college. Each member of the teaching staff has an average of 20 students allotted to him for tutorial supervision. The purpose of the system is to make available the guidance and advice of faculty members to enable the students to participate effectively in various curricular and extra curricular activities. The students are provided with proper career guidance so that he/she is able to choose a suitable career from among the available opportunities. Various problems faced by the students are also attended to through this system. Teachers play a pivotal role in preventing students from succumbing to the dehumanizing effects of drug abuse, communalism and other social evils. The weaker sections particularly the SC/ST receive special attention from the group tutor. Class wise meeting of students, parents and teachers is held every term for evaluating the performance of their wards. Dr. Smitha Sasidharan (Dept. of Chemistry) is the incharge of the Tutorial system.

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME (SSP)

The government of Kerala had launched the Scholar Support Programme that aims at imparting personalized academic support to needy students through tutorials, study materials, additional lectures, question banks and interactive sessions, formation of quality circles in colleges for the programme, dissemination of class through personal and web based modes etc. Smt. Sreedevi Gopalakrishnan (Department of Economics) coordinates the programme.

WALK WITH A SCHOLAR (WWS)

Walk with a Scholar is a project of government of Kerala that proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programs for students in under graduate programs and to provide guidance for their future. The scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to needy students, to prepare them for employment and give them necessary guidance, motivation and mental support to identify appropriate areas for higher study as well as employment. Dr. Anju K.S. (Department of Chemistry) is the coordinator.
