SANKAR'S DAY- 48TH DEATH ANNIVERSARY OF SRI. R SANKAR

The 48th Death Anniversary of Sri R. Sankar ,Founder Manager Sree Narayana Colleges, Sree Narayana Trust, Kollam was observed on 7th November 2020.

The Regional Development Committee Members, Principal and staff of Sree Narayana College Chengannur organized various functions to commemorate the day. The commemorative function was held in Google Meet Platform at 10.30am. Dr. A. V Anandaraj, Convenor, Sub-RDC Chengannur inaugurated the function. Sri. Anil P Sreerangam preside the function. About the function.....

Sree Narayana Trusts was formed in 1952; Shri. R. Sankar was the first General Secretary of the S.N Trusts. Under his stewardship, S.N Trusts, named after Narayana Guru, functioned effectively and efficiently. The main intention behind the formation of S.N Trusts is to manage the educational institutions under S.N.D.P Yogam. The institutions operated by the Trust follow their spiritual guide's footsteps, trying to create strength through organisation and to seek liberation through education. The Trust aims to realize the high ideals of its namesake, who professed the welfare of all without any discrimination on the basis of caste, creed or religion. It was formed by the former Chief Minister of Kerala, Shri. R. Sankar in 1952 to manage the Sree Narayana College, Kollam. Later, more educational institutions were started in other parts of Kerala for the upliftment of the socially and educationally backward strata of society. Today, the Trust runs numerous educational institutions and hospitals.

Sri Anil P Sreerangam.....

Sri. R Sankar was born to Raman and Kunjalamma on 30 April 1909 in Kuzhikkalidavaka village in Puthoor, Kollam district. He did his formal education in the Puthoor Primary School and later continued in an English School in Kottarakkara. In 1924, he joined Maharajas College (present University College) to gain a degree in Chemistry. He was supported financially for his education by a wealthy relative, as his father could not afford the expenses. He also worked as a teacher for a short span of time before he moved to

the Government Law College, Thiruvananthapuram in 1933. His appointment as principal of Sivagiri High School made him associate with the activities of the Sree Narayana Dharma Paripalana Yogam (SNDP Yogam). He talked about the social injustice prevalent in those days, particularly the discriminatory attitude shown towards backward class communities, and also equal opportunities for backward classes.

The educational reforms brought in by Sri R Sankar have played a crucial role in the education sector of Kerala. Sri R Sankar, by creating more educational facilities paved the way for socially backward classes of Kerala to reach the main stream of society

Sri. R Sankar believed and followed the principle of Sri Narayana Guru..”Enlightenment through education “.He was drawn to freedom movement and became an active member of the Indian National Congress in Travancore State. After India’s independence he focused his attention on strengthening the Congress party

Later, he took a break from the Congress party and began to work in the SNDP Yogam. During his long association with the SNDP Yogam of over 13 years, he served as its General Secretary for over a span of 10 years and President and Chief of the SN Trust. Under his leadership the SNDP Yogam gave emphasis to the field of education and started many educational institutions. SNDP Yogam celebrated its Golden Jubilee year while Sankar was the General Secretary in 1953. As part of a year-long celebration he organised an Exhibition in Kollam which is marked in the history of the State as 'SNDP Kanaka Jubilee'

Sankar returned to the Congress and was elected to the Travancore State Assembly in 1948. He also became the member of the Travancore-Cochin State Assembly from 1949 to 1956. Sankar was member of the Constituent Assembly and also member of the Franchise and Delimitation Commission and the Reforms Committee constituted after the introduction of the Responsible Government.

He led the Congress party as Kerala Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) President during the *Vimochana Samaram* (Liberation Struggle) in 1958. The Congress won the elections in 1960 under R. Sankar’s leadership. Though Congress gained majority of seats in the Elections of 1960 to the Kerala Legislative Assembly, Pattom Thanupillai of the Praja Socialist Party was given the Chief Ministership (CM) and Sankar became the Deputy Chief Minister in the Pattom Thanupillai ministry. He handled the portfolio of Finance from 1960

Sankar died at the age of 63 on 7 November 1972. The Assembly paid its homage to him on 13 November 1972.
