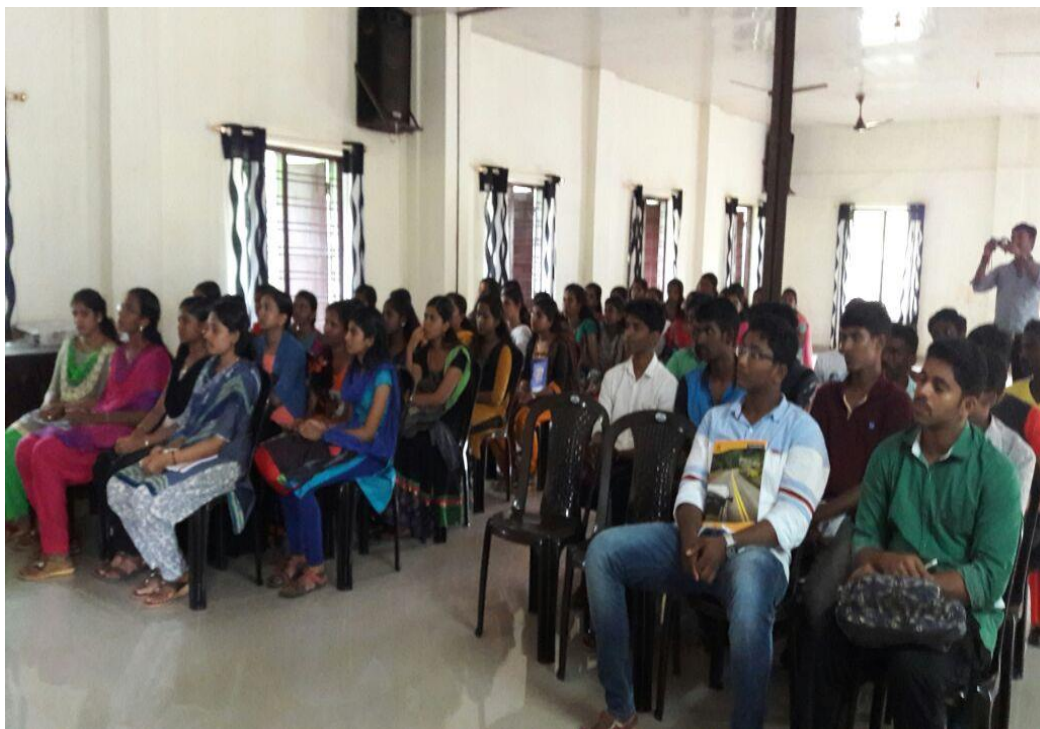
3.1 HIGHLIGHT OF THE PROGRAMME

have completed 18 years voluntarily came forward to enrol their names in electoral roll. The programme concluded with vote of thanks .

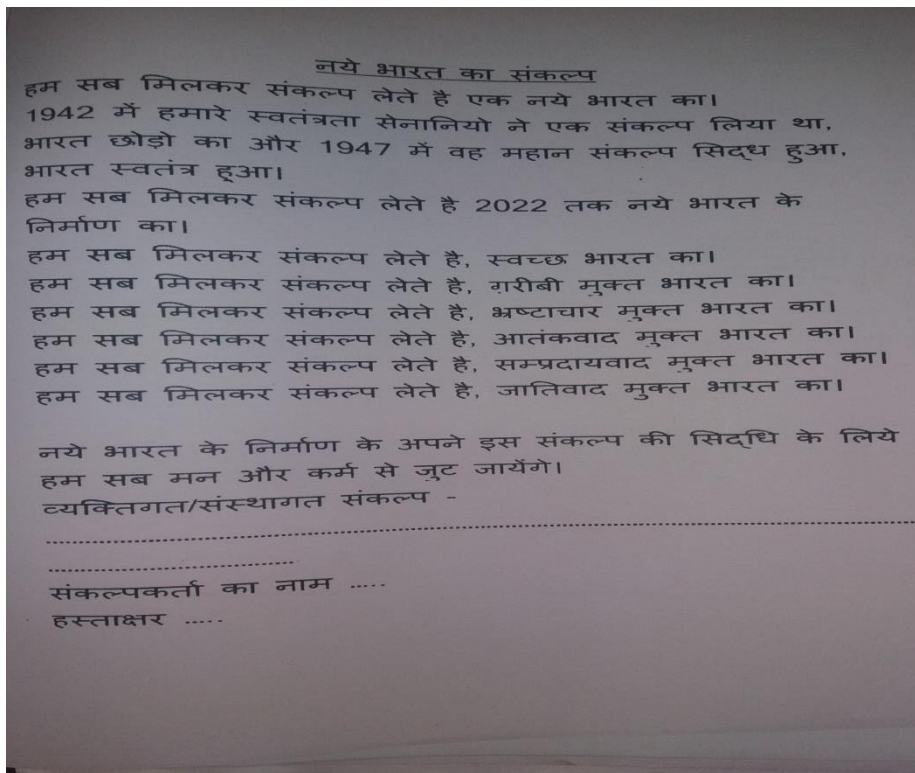


Awareness class by Deputy Tahasildar of Chengannur taluk
